A	<i>Oryzopsis hymenoides</i>	Indian ricegrass	C3	Intermountain West	bunchgrass, forming clonal rings
B	<i>Poa pratensis</i>	Kentucky blugrass	C3	eastern US	bunchgrass, most common 'lawn' grass
C	<i>Cynodon dactylon</i>	Bermuda grass	C4	southern Asia	invasive sod grass species, lawn species in southern US
D	<i>Pennisetum setaceum</i>	fountain grass	C4	Africa & southern Asia	invasive bunchgrass; cultivated as an ornamental
E	<i>Miscanthus sinensis</i>	miscanthus	C4	eastern Asia	invasive bunchgrass; cultivated as a biofuel
F	<i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i>	little bluestem	C4	Great Plains	bunchgrass, native to Great Plains, several cultivars
G	<i>Saccharum ravennae</i>	hardy pampas grass	C4	southern Asia	invasive bunchgrass; common in marshes
H	<i>Calamagrostis acutiflora</i>	calamagrostis 'Karl Foerster'	C3	Europe	bunchgrass, tall variety cultivated by Karl Foerster
I	<i>Helictotrichon sempervirens</i>	blue oat grass	C3	Europe	bunchgrass, European grasslands, drought tolerant
J	<i>Bouteloua gracilis</i>	blue grama	C4	shortgrass prairie	sod grass, one of most common prairie grasses

	<i>Bouteloua curtipendula</i>	sideoats grass	C4	Great Plains	sod grass, tallgrass and shortgrass, Great Plains
	<i>Bromus tectorum</i>	cheatgrass	C3	central Asia	springtime invasive annual; common in Utah deserts
	<i>Cortaderia selloana 'pumila'</i>	dwarf pampas grass	C4	pampas, South America	invasive bunchgrass in wet habitats; widely planted
	<i>Panicum virgatum</i>	switchgrass	C4	Great Plains	bunchgrass, now cultivated in Midwest as a biofuel
	<i>Phragmites australis</i>	common reed	C3	Europe	invasive growing on wet, marshy sites across campus
	<i>Setaria pumila</i>	foxtail grass	C4	southern Europe	invasive annual
	<i>Sporobolus heterolepis</i>	prairie dropseed	C4	Great Plains	bunchgrass
